Wellington

Gateway to The Wrekin Forest and the Weald Moors

Wellington is ideally placed between the Wrekin Forest and Shropshire Hills to the South and the Weald Moors and the Shropshire Plain to the North. Getting to Wellington is easy by car, bus, train and even by plane:-

By road: The M54 links the town to the national motorway network (exit at Junctions 6 & 7). Parking in and around the town is FREE and some car parks allow stays of up to 10 hours – leaving plenty of time to explore the town and surrounding area on foot or by bicycle.

By bus: Wellington Bus Station is located close to the heart of the town.

By train: Wellington Railway Station is adjacent to the bus station.

By air: Birmingham Airport is under 1 hour away from Wellington by train.

Accommodation: Wellington and the surrounding area provides a wide range of accommodation consisting of hotels, guest houses and self-catering cottages. There are also Youth Hostels close by in the Ironbridge Gorge at Coalbrookdale and Coalport.



Our Regular Walks

We provide FREE guided walks on the 1st and 3rd SUNDAY of each month starting at 2:00pm outside Wellington Leisure Centre, TF1 1LX. Walks typically last between 90 – 120 minutes. Our walks take us to the Ercall Nature Reserve; the internationally renowned Ercall Quarry; Limekiln Woods; Apley Woods; Dothill and Shawbirch Local Nature Reserve; and The Wrekin, as well as exploring other local footpaths.

There is ample free short stay car parking at the Leisure Centre and long stay parking across the road (entrance at the bottom of Wrekin Road).
