

	Site of plaque, grave of parents and gift of a writing desk, by his family on his death Also view point for the Coalbrookdale Institute (now a youth hostel) where he used to lecture, and on Tuesday, 9th February, 1882, gave the first successful demonstration of Swan and Edison's incandescent lamps. There were seven lamps, which were run from two Parker storage batteries. The lamps ran for fifteen minutes and provided 20 candlepower, and lit the room nearly as well as the 18 gas jets that were usually in action.
